14 DAYS IN ARGENTINA

Situated between the Andes and the Atlantic, every inch of Argentina—the world's eighth-largest country in terms of land mass—begs to be discovered. There's cosmopolitan Buenos Aires, with its tango, fine leather and furs; the chic porteños' weekend getaway destination Punta del Este; Mendoza, the Napa Valley of the southern hemisphere; the topographically blessed Bariloche, with its big sky, mountains and shores; and the bucolic side of Córdoba, where horses and UNESCO heritage sites reign. Two weeks is hardly enough, but here's a best-of tour of the country, sure to whet your appetite for más.

BEACH BLISS

A driver takes you about 10 miles northeast to the town of José Ignacio, where you'll squeeze in a bit of boutique hopping, hitting Bajo el Alma for beautiful tunics. This afternoon you'll check into Playa Vik Jose Ignacio to enjoy the beachy side of life in this region. Indulge in a chilled glass of claricot (white sangria) at outdoor eatery La Huella, and spend a leisurely day at the beach, enjoying the late sunset. Tonight, your driver escorts you through the countryside for a romantic dinner on the outdoor patio at chef Francis Mallmann's restaurant El Garzón.

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
