And over in Uruguay, the beach village of José Ignacio is now home to Playa Vik, whose stone, glass, and curved-titanium structure was built by worldclass Uruguayan architect Carlos Ott; its nineteen suites boast works by local artists. Besides swimming—cantilevered above the sea, the 75foot black-granite pool is a stunner—surfing, and kayaking on the property, guests can go hiking and horseback riding five miles inland at Estancia Vik, Playa Vik's sister hotel.
